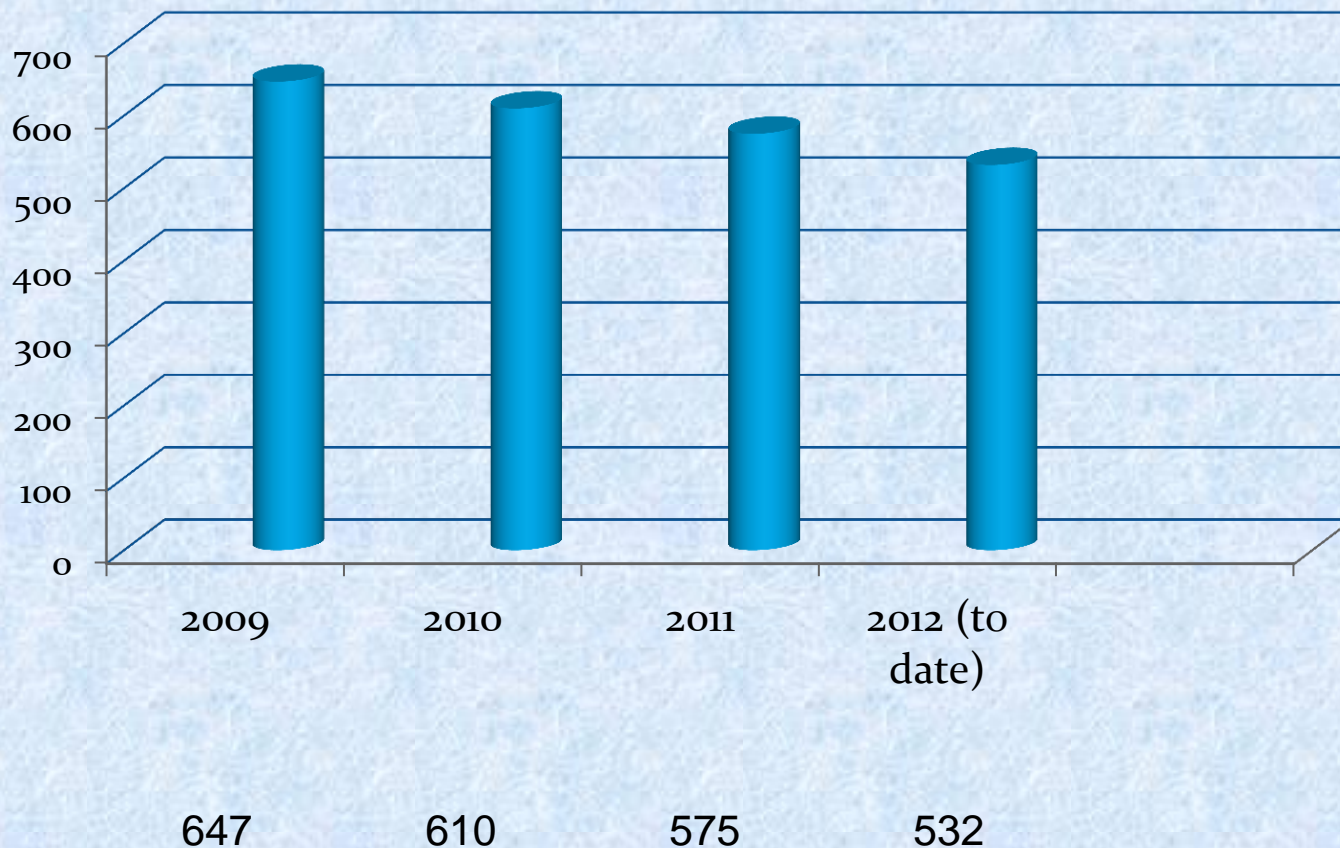

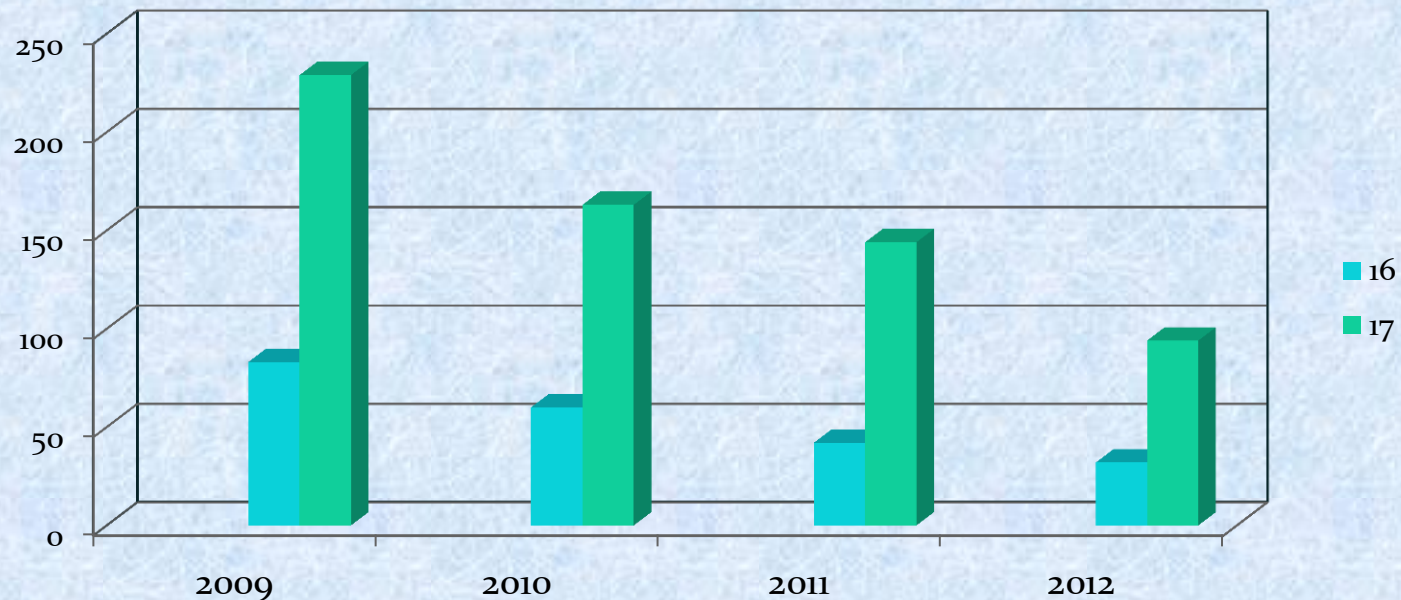
1. Please Provide Data on your Case Loads for FY 2009, 2011 and 2012?

6. What Cross-Agency Initiatives have you Undertaken/would you Propose to meet the Multiple Service Needs of Many of these Justice-Involved Youth?

The following cross agency initiatives continue to be held at MYI:

Interdisciplinary Meetings – Meet bi-weekly to discuss management of complex offenders, review progression of Special Management offenders. Chaired by the Warden, includes all appropriate MYI staff and representatives from Dept. of Children & Families, Corr. Managed Health Care, and Office of the Child Advocate.

Transition Planning Interagency Meetings – Meet monthly to discuss involved discharge planning concerns for complex offenders referred by Mental Health. Through collaboration of the mentioned agencies, the mission is to aid in the successful reintegration of the discharging youth offender into his community. Chaired by Deputy Warden of Programs and includes representatives from DOC, MYI, Unified School District #1, Court Support Services Division, Corr. Managed Health Care Dept. of Children & Families, Dept. of Mental Health & Addiction Services and Public Defender's Office.

Reentry Working Group Meetings – Meet bi-monthly to discuss potential issues related to the reentry process which can include a specific offender or global issues. The mission is to provide updates on any new developments/trends related to the successful reintegration of our discharging youthful offenders. Chaired by the Deputy Warden of Programs. Representatives from DOC, MYI, Parole, Unified School District #1, New Haven Family Alliance, Community Mediation in New Haven, Family Re-entry in Bridgeport, Office of the Child Advocate, and Corr. Managed Health Care.
